## Covid Reminders

We are continuing to follow the Government guidance for Covid. i.e.

- If your child displays any of the three symptoms below, they should isolate immediately and take a PCR test. Isolation should continue until the result of the PCR test has been returned.
- If your child continues to test using Lateral Flow Devices at home either by ordering them online or from a pharmacy and tests positive, they need to get a PCR test and isolate until the result has been returned.
- If your child tests positive for Covid this isolation period may last up to 10 days. If they test negative on the morning of day 5 and on the morning of day 6 they may leave isolation immediately and come to school on that same day. If a positive result is returned then this process should continue until two consecutive negative results are returned when taken 24hrs apart.

**To keep our pupils and staff safe please do not send your child to school if they display any of these 3 symptoms, no matter how mild they are:**

1. **Persistent cough**
2. **High temperature (anything over 38 degrees)**
3. **Loss of taste and/or smell**

The Department for Education have asked us to share the information below:

### ***Information for parents and carers on COVID-19 vaccination for at risk 5 to 11 year olds***

*Children aged 5 to 11 years who are in a clinical risk group or who live with someone who is immunosuppressed can get the COVID-19 vaccine, in line with advice set out by the [Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation \(JCVI\)](#). Eligible children include those with diabetes, immunosuppression, learning disabilities, and other conditions as outlined by the [UK Health Security Agency \(UKHSA\) in the Green Book](#).*

*Vaccinations help to increase protection against COVID-19, which is particularly important for those with underlying health conditions.*

*Further information is available in the [guide for parents of children aged 5 to 11 years](#) published by UKHSA. We have published some [frequently asked questions](#) on the vaccination programme including information on eligibility, accessibility and advice for parents of children at high risk from COVID-19. Following [advice](#) from the JCVI, healthy 5 to 11 year old children will also be offered two 10 microgram doses of the COVID-19 vaccine. The NHS will prepare to extend this non-urgent offer to all children during April.*
